Advising needs range from major and career exploration to strategies for entering a professional career path including networking strategies, resume/cover letter writing, and interviewing skills. Advisers have specializations in the social sciences, humanities, arts, STEM field, pre-health, pre-law, as well as internships and other experiential activities.


